

CRIARL Member Access to Online Licensed Databases

Institution	Description
Brown University	We have a total of 8 public access workstations in the Brown University Libraries: 4 at the Rockefeller Library, 3 in the Science Library and 1 in the Orwig Music Library. CRIARL faculty and students may be granted access to the Rockefeller Library or Sciences Library with a CRIARL ID card issued by their home library.
Community College of Rhode Island	All visitors to the CCRI libraries have access to our public work stations and will be able to access, use, and print from our databases (pay for print). As Rhode Island residents, with a current photo ID, visitors may obtain a RI Resident's Borrowers Card, giving them the ability to borrow from our print collection as well.
Johnson & Wales University	At JWU, we have computers for visitor use, and from these our visitors have access to JWU Library databases.
Naval War College Library	The Naval War College Library has twelve "open access" workstations in the Learning Commons that link to all of their licensed databases. These are available to the public (anyone with visitor access to the NWC).
Providence College	The same is true at PC- non PC affiliates and community patrons have access to 4 workstations, logged in by PC staff, providing onsite access to eResources.
Providence Athenaeum	The Providence Athenaeum does not have any online databases at this time, and the only one public terminal is available for searching the collection.
Rhode Island College	Our computers are available for the public to use and they can access our databases as well.
Rhode Island Historical Society	Once patrons register, we provide free access to two subscription databases: Ancestry.com and Fold3. Fold3 is particularly strong for military records.
Rhode Island State Law Library	The RI State Law Library is open to the public and offers many online databases that all users are welcome to use within our network. We also have county libraries within the state (Kent, Newport, Washington, and Prov-Garrahy) that offer legal research databases as well.
Rhode Island State Library	The State Library currently does not have any online databases, but when we do get one, we plan to have it available on one of our public computers.
Roger Williams University School of Law	At our library, any authorized visitor may use the open computing area and databases linked from our website, with the exception of those that require an individual login (Lexis, Westlaw, and a few others).
